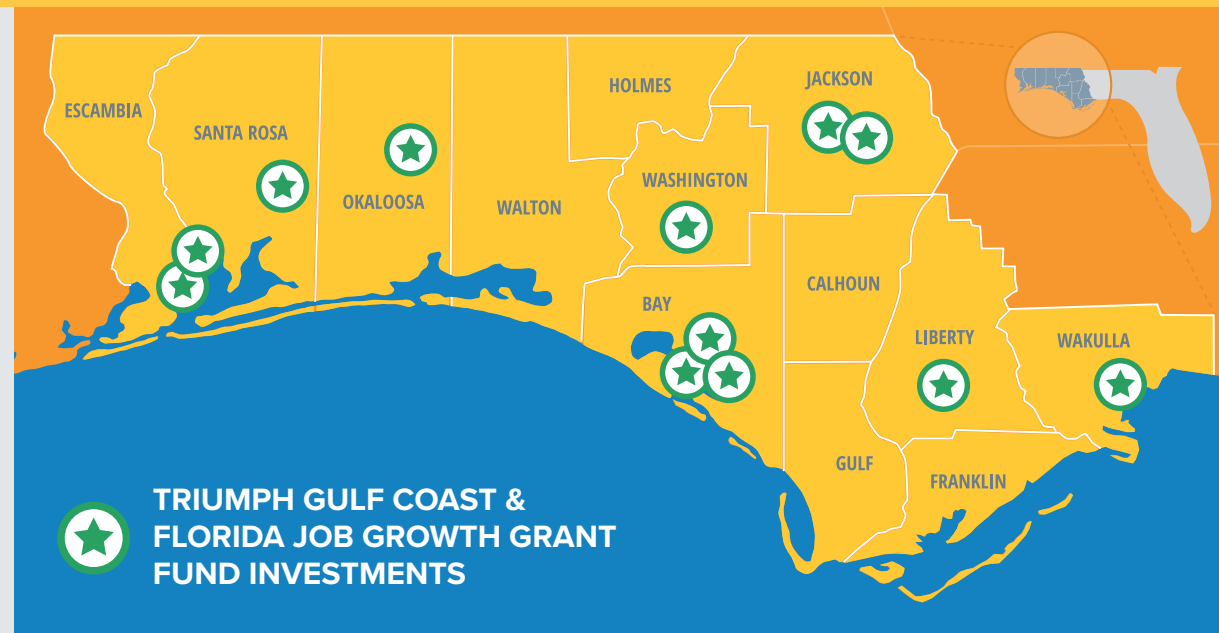

Triumph Gulf Coast, Inc., a 7-member board of private sector business leaders appointed by state leadership, is responsible for distributing \$300 million of the funds immediately for economic development projects located in the 8 disproportionately affected counties. An additional \$80 million will be available each year until 2033. The funds could be used to:

- Provide the equivalent of up to 100% abatement of property taxes, including school taxes, for up to 10 years
- Support infrastructure needs, such as buildings, roadways, rail spurs, utilities and more, for competitive projects
- Develop industry-driven workforce training programs to drive business growth

### FLORIDA JOB GROWTH GRANT FUND

The Florida Legislature reaffirmed its commitment to economic development by creating the Florida Job Growth Grant Fund in 2017 and funding it with \$85 million dollars. For 2018-2019, another \$85 million is available for Governor Scott, through the support of the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity and Enterprise Florida, to allocate for the improvement of public infrastructure and enhancement of workforce training across the state.

Funds have been allocated to Northwest Florida communities to:

- Improve public infrastructure at airports to support business expansion and expand capacity
- Purchase equipment to support workforce training in targeted industries
- Provide for infrastructure development at industrial sites and business parks
- Support students earning industry-recognized credentials and degrees in targeted industries
