# **EMPLOYER & PERSONAL COMMITMENT**

The schedule of Leadership Northwest Florida is intense as a seven-session program presented across the region, but participation is imperative to receive the full value of the time and money invested in the program. Program participants are expected to be actively engaged and attend all sessions. Any absences, both expected or emergency, must be discussed promptly between the participant, FGNW staff, and the participant's employer.

# **TUITION AND PAYMENT POLICY**

Tuition to participate in Leadership Northwest Florida is:

- FGNW Investors: \$2,000
- Non-FGNW Investors: \$2,500

Tuition covers registration fees, activities, meeting materials, space rentals, meals, opening retreat, graduation, and transportation services when applicable. Tuition does not include travel across the region or overnight accommodations. Payment via check or ACH is due within 15 days of acceptance into the program. If tuition is not received by this date, you may be dropped from the class.

# **SELECTION CRITERIA**

Florida's Great Northwest Foundation Board of Directors serves as the selection committee for Leadership Northwest Florida. FGNW investors will be given selection preference. The FGNW Foundation seeks to identify individuals most likely to utilize their leadership abilities for the long-term benefit and betterment of Northwest Florida.

Characteristics of ideal applicants include:

- Experienced professionals with community and/or career leadership contributions
- Demonstrated commitment to the community and region through past and present activities
- Willingness to commit the time and energy necessary for the program and future involvement in regional economic development
- Demonstrated leadership trajectory
- Formal commitment and full support of current employer

No more than 25 individuals will be selected per class. The selection committee will strive to select participants with broad professional, geographic, ethnic and gender representation.
